Michigan's project is helping to transform adult learning in Michigan to support implementation of IDEA and improve child/student achievement.

This work is being developed and implemented by a partnership of more than 70 members, reflecting linkages with Michigan's school districts, professional associations, agencies, organizations, and community groups. The IDEA Partnership has the potential to support the implementation of IDEA through adult learning initiatives across these stakeholder groups.

The logic model developed by the Partners and depicted on the next page guides the design and continuing evaluation of the Partnership's work.

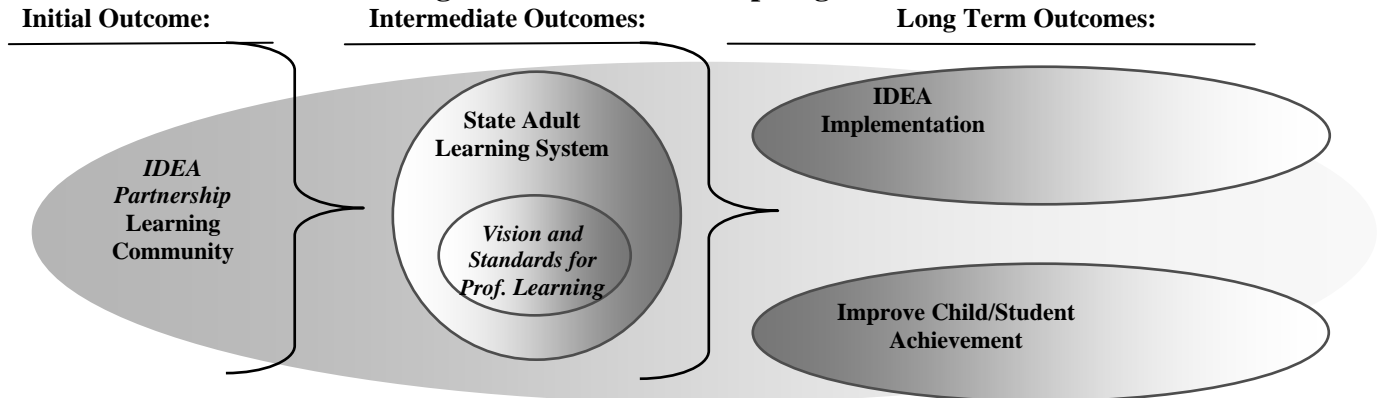

Michigan’s IDEA Partnership Logic Model



Partnership Purpose: *Help transform adult learning in Michigan to support implementation of IDEA and improve child/student achievement.*

Partnership Outcomes:

Initial Outcome:

- **Learning community:** Create a context that supports the development of a learning community with clarified structure, communication practices and commitments for purposeful integration of adult learning opportunities.

Intermediate Outcomes:

- **State Adult Learning System:** Help transform the system into a more comprehensive, integrated adult learning system, inclusive of ALL members of the educational community.
- **PD Vision and Standards:** Use the State Board adopted *Vision and Standards for Professional Learning of Michigan Educators* to guide decisions about quality adult learning practices.

Long Term Outcomes:

- **IDEA implementation:** Improve the knowledge, skills and readiness among all partners to support IDEA implementation.
- **Child/student achievement:** Increase child/student development {IDEA 636 (d)}, academic achievement and functional performance {IDEA 614(d)(1)(A)(i)(I)}.

IDEA PARTNERSHIP SESSIONS:

- **October 29, 2004:** *Establish learning community connections around adult learning*
- **January 25, 2005:** *Explore the aspects of an adult learning system that foster enhanced implementation of IDEA*
- **May 12, 2005:** *Identify accountability/evaluation components of an evidence-based adult learning system*
- **August 11, 2005:** *Identify continuing opportunities for purposeful integration of adult learning to impact child/student achievement*

Note: In August, 2003, Michigan’s State Board of Education adopted the National Staff Development Council’s *Standards for Staff Development, Revised* as part of the *Vision and Standards for Professional Learning of Michigan Educators*.
